And while American success is important to her, Adele insists it doesn't mean more than winning over audiences around the world.

"I want as many people as possible to hear my music," she says. "I want to do well in Europe, Asia and Australia. It's so weird to come all this way to do shows and have them

sell out. It's ridiculous and amazing how many people want to talk to me."

Adele admits she's a person who feels incomplete without a relationship, but for now, she's burying her sorrows in between performances with soda and Cheetos... and refuses to obsess over her weight, either.

"I love food and hate exercise," she laughs. "I don't have time to work out. Go buy my record; then I'll be able to lose weight. I actually don't care. I don't want to be on the cover of Playboy or Vogue. I want to be on the cover of Rolling Stone or Q. I'm not a trend-setter... I'm a singer. I never want to be known for anything else. I'd rather weigh a ton and make an amazing album then look like Nicole Richie and do a s*** album. My aim in life is never to be skinny."

Don't expect Adele to fall into the trap of living the blues to sing them, though.

"With this album, I had to be feeling quite sorry for myself to be creative," she says. "When I tried to write about fictional stuff, made-up stories or other people's problems, I couldn't do it. But who knows? My second album might be really happy."

Remember the name: Adele. After listening to her debut album 19, you won't forget the voice.

Skating remembers two industry leaders

The roller skating world said goodbye to Ernest Dean St. Germain who passed away peacefully May 12, 2011 with his family at his side. Ernie was born in Cedar Rapids, Iowa on October 9, 1925. He was the youngest of six children.

Ernie served on submarines in the U.S. Navy. He was a life member of the Submarine Veterans of WWII and was instrumental in the formation of Iowa and Sacramento Chapters.

Ernie spent 27 years in the broadcasting business doing everything from radio announcing to TV producing/directing. He worked for NBC News for 12 years as a news crew member in Sacramento.

He was active in the Capital Quarter Midgets Racing Association for many years since both his son and youngest daughter were enthusiastic drivers. He started a film library for the national association, which the family still possesses.

In 1977, Ernie and his wife Evelyn opened the Cal-Skate Milpitas Roller Skating rink and at one time were operating rinks in Milpitas, Fresno and Clovis. After Evelyn passed away in 1992, Ernie retired from daily operations and began traveling and playing golf. Three years later, he was fortunate to meet Deanna Rodrigues and they spent 16 years together, taking cruises and enjoying trips to San Francisco.

Ernie was an enthusiastic San Jose Sharks fan and rarely missed a game. He often played coach for his beloved team and was even surprised with a personal visit by two players in recent years.

Ernie is survived by his brother Edward Earl, his children: Deborah Brady, Jilla St. Germain, Trace St. Germain and Chris St. Germain-Frank; his grandchildren: Mathieu, Jeffrey, and Geena, great-

grandchildren: Kainoa and Sequoia, and his dear companion, Deanna Rodrigues.

A celebration of his life was held on Wednesday, May 25th with those in attendance wearing Hawaiian casual, as requested by Ernie. 
